



This online discussion series was conducted with the participation of Senior members of SLAS and CAS during the past month through Facebook live.





SUMMARY OF THE DISCUSSION BETWEEN SASA-EXCO AND THEN SECRETARY TO THE PRESIDENT

The President of SASA extended his gratitude to the Secretary to the President for allocating a date for the meeting and explained briefly about the upcoming events by SASA. He also emphasized the fact that SLAS is having a strong mechanism to actively contribute for the development of the country even during the pandemic period. The necessity of maintaining a closer and stronger communication and coordination between SASA and the higher Public Officials was explained in this discussion. The President sought the assistance in executing this process in order to find the effective solutions for the issues regarding SLAS.

The SASA President requested for a leadership initiative from the Secretary to the President, in order to strengthen the second level leadership of the public service through capacity development.

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The Secretary to the President extended his greetings to the newly elected Executive Committee and mentioned that he can be reached through telephone at any time and the meetings can be arranged at very short notice.

The Secretary to the President commented that the expected role is not rendered from the senior officials in the process of building up and mentoring the second level leadership. He mentioned that the prevailing promotion scheme is not satisfactory and young officers should be given opportunity for promotion based on their skills and capabilities. The Secretary to the President also appreciated the significant service given by the District Secretaries and Divisional Secretaries during hard times.

He also stated that a series of seminar will be held in order to exchange views with higher public officers regarding the execution of budget proposals and other important matters.

The SASA President emphasized the importance of the recommendations and suggestions highlighted by the Secretary to the President and ensured the fact that SASA will be acting in a closer coordination and maximum contribution.



KEY MATTERS DISCUSSED AT THE EXCO- MEETING

It was noted that the Cabinet approval has been granted to increase the maximum age of retirement up to 65 years and the Secretary, Ministry of Public Services has issued the circular accordingly. The Executive Committee requested to committee already appointed in this regard, to study the PA Circular No. 02/2022 and submit a report on the impact of the same to the next meeting of the Executive Committee.

It was decided to remind the Prime Minister's Office to organize the meeting with relevant stakeholders regarding the establishment of SASA resource center, as agreed during the meeting with the Secretary to the Prime Minister. The SASA special subcommittee appointed for this purpose was requested to prepare an activity plan for this venture. It was reported that several Branch Association meetings were organized recently. It was further reported that the other meetings will be organized at the earliest. SASA Ex-officio members from the Association of Divisional Secretaries & Assistant Divisional Secretaries were requested to provide the maximum support for the reorganization of branch associations.

It was emphasized that the Grievance Handling should be one of the prime tasks of the SASA Executive Committee so as to build the confidence among the members of SASA.

Necessity of a fundraising activity was stressed. There were proposals to conduct an online lottery, a YouTube channel and a musical event. The relevant SASA subcommittee was requested to discuss and identify suitable programmes to be implemented at the earliest.



VOICES FROM OVERSEAS



First tell us about yourself

My name is Leelanath Wickrama Arachchi and my friends call me Wickrama. I have been serving as an officer of Sri Lanka Administrative Service from 2010 and I have worked in Sandilippay Divisional Secretariat, Eastern Provincial Council and in Election Commission of Sri Lanka. I am passionate about language policy in Sri Lanka as well as participatory policy designing.

What made you apply for Australian Awards Scholarship?

As members of Sri Lanka Administrative Service, we are fortunate to contribute the development of our country by making critical decisions at the right time. Australia Awards scholarships are given annually by the Australian Government as a development assistance for our country. Therefore, I thought that obtaining one such scholarship is a way of committing myself to the development of Sri Lanka. By giving these scholarships, Australians wish to help Sri Lanka to fill the knowledge gap in the development arena, and therefore, I also wanted to apply for an Australian Awards Scholarship and try to bring the modest knowledge of development to my country.

Secondly, I thought that Australian Awards Scholarship would give me the best learning experience. I finished my bachelor's degree from the University of Sri Jayewardenepura back in 2009. However, the Sri Lankan University learning process is more teacher-centric and therefore, sometimes it hinders students to develop their potentials but parroting the lecturers' ideas in assessments. Moreover, I wanted to give my son a strong basement in his education by introducing him to the student-centric primary education system in Australia. An awardee can experience the advanced technology and the customer friendly services and living in a country like Australia will give a person number of opportunities to improve.

How was your journey to Australia?

I was selected as an awardee in August 2019 and therefore I had enough time to get myself ready to meet the new challenges. I had almost four months for the preparation, however amidst that I had to fulfill my usual duties as the Assistant Commissioner of Elections of Polonnaruwa District, including the Presidential Election, 2019. I had a folder starting with the Application for the Award and, I still remember me seeing that folder growing thicker with various documents.

Then, on the 8th of January me, my wife and my son arrived in Canberra. It was all new for me as this was my first time in Australia. Soon after, I started the preparatory course in Crawford School of Public Policy at Australian National University.

What are your unforgettable memories in Australia?

It is not an exaggeration, if I say that every day is an unforgettable memory in my life. However, I can never forget the day I went to see the Sydney Opera House as it was my life-time dream. I really like the course I studied with Professor Hendriks, 'Public Participation and Engagement in Public Policy'.

She was an outstanding teacher, and the discussion was amazing which invited me to develop many fresh ideas and connect them to the context of my home country Another one memory is a bit of hilarious. I always wanted to donate blood and tried many times when I was in Sri Lanka but it failed as I had a history of 'Yellow Fever'. However, I had a chance to donate blood in Australia where they can still use blood from a person like me.

The donation was successful and after the donation I fainted and all the staff in the red cross happened to attend me until I recover. The red cross sent me a letter to appreciate my donation and to request me not to participate in any future blood donations.

As you think, why a young officer should follow a master's degree from a foreign university?

A foreign institute would not give you only a degree title, but also an ability to identify your skills in researc hing, critically analysing and arguing.

These skills are essential for budding officers to contribute to the country's development in their full capacity. And such skills never lead you to a wrong or a weak decision. Therefore, especially an officer of Sri Lanka Administrative Service should improve such abilities by engaging with an advanced study program. Australia Awards Scholarships allow you to select one from the best universities in the world which owns many leading scholars in the field.

Other than the modern academic skills you gain, the network you build in such institutes provides you with enormous opportunities in both your professional and personal lives. You will be studying with many other international students. They may bring their insights with the same policy issues you study, and these discussions will broaden your understanding about the issue as well as the possible policy solutions.

Such experiences are not possible in a local university and therefore, I highly recommend young officers to apply a degree program outside the country and let these different experiences enhance one's ability to perform as a good manager.
